Hunger is one of the greatest injustices facing our world. Ending Hunger One Step at a Time is the official motto of the CROP Hunger Walks, community wide walk events organized by religious groups, schools and others across the nation to support

Church World Service, a faith based

organization that helps communities across the globe deal with hunger, poverty, displacement and disaster. Twenty five percent of the funds raised are returned to the local communities that host walks.



Since 1975, Dutchess Interfaith Council has participated in the CROP Hunger Walk raising \$1,787,751.00 from teams and individuals walking 6 miles throughout the city of Poughkeepsie. Last year, 200 people walked in the pouring rain to raise \$57, 252.75. Of that extraordinary amount, \$24,000 was raised by "Team Moody" from Freedom Plains United Presbyterian Church to honor the legacy of Mary Moody who passed away on March 28, 2019.

Mary Law Moody was an avid supporter of the CROP Walk for 42 years. Believing that when one serves others God can multiply one's efforts, she gave many people the opportunity to alleviate hunger and poverty by sponsoring her in the Council's annual CROP Walk. From the money that was raised last year, \$14,313.19 was returned to our community and distributed to Dutchess Outreach, Dutchess Community Action Agency, Fishkill Food Bank, and Beulah Baptist Food Bank.

Mary Moody is not the only hero in our local CROP Walk. Last year, the Dutchess Interfaith Council honored Rose Marie Proctor of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Poughkeepsie. Ms. Proctor has walked every year for 40 years in

the CROP Walk. She was inspired to start walking because she heard that there were poor women in thirdworld countries who walked miles and miles just to get water. "If they could walk that far to get water, the least I could do was six miles to help them."

This year, the CROP Walk will be held virtually. Teams and individuals who walk can get creative about how to raise money. People can walk six miles around their block or find a local trail. Virtual walks can be a car parade or donation drives that don't include walking. Even though the walks may be virtual, the need is REAL.


